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

PRESENT IDEAS ONLY WHEN THEY'RE NEEDED




PRESENT IDEAS ONLY WHEN THEY'RE NEEDED (AND IN THE RIGHT SEQUENCE)




MAKE THE EXPERIENCE REAL(-ISH)

OTHER KEY PRINCIPLES

- Focus on process, not product
- Show them what you're doing before you do it
- Let them make the exercise their own
