

STORMWATER MONITORING PROGRAM

Monitoring is in the fifth year of the permit term. NCTCOG Staff and Consultant are finalizing the BMP Analysis and Evaluation Plan (BANEP) and Final Summary Report.

The BMP Analysis and Evaluation Plan (BANEP) is a high-level approach for evaluating BMPs through the RWWCP.

- NCTCOG staff is working with TCEQ and monitoring participants to develop a proposal to continue the program in a new permit term.
- Our Current plan is to develop new program proposal and select consultant in 2023 and continue monitoring activities in 2024.


