ACTION:

Item 1 Approval of Minutes

President Strength stated that the first item on the agenda was approval of the Minutes from the May Executive Board meeting.

Upon a Motion by Judge Whitley (seconded by Councilmember Wilemon), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the minutes of the May Executive Board meeting.

Item 2 Resolution Approving 2018 Emergency Preparedness Planning Council (EPPC) Bylaws Update

Mike Eastland, Executive Director, explained that Molly McFadden, Director of Emergency Preparedness, was out of the office. He presented proposed changes to the Bylaws of the Emergency Preparedness Planning Council, including changes in the required two-thirds majority vote and the membership of the Council, as reflected in Attachment 1 to the Resolution. He explained that the Emergency Preparedness Planning Council (EPPC) is an advisory council to the NCTCOG Executive Board and recommends approval of the proposed Bylaw amendments by the Executive Board.

Upon a Motion by Councilmember Lombard (seconded by Mayor McCowan), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the resolution as presented.

Item 3 Resolution Authorizing a Contract With a Public Accounting Firm for Audit and Advisory Services

Judge Whitley announced that although he is no longer connected with the selected firm, he recuse himself in order to avoid any appearance of a conflict of interest.

Monte Mercer, Deputy Executive Director, explained that NCTCOG recently conducted a competitive procurement for independent audit and advisory services. He told the Board that the audit committee had met to consider this item and had recommended approval of a contract with the public accounting firm of Whitley Penn, LLP, for a maximum five year term and a total amount not to exceed \$845,900. Judge Jenkins recommended approval on behalf of the Audit Committee.

Upon a Motion by Judge Jenkins (seconded by Councilmember Wilemon), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the resolution as presented.

Judge Whitley returned to the meeting.

Item 4 Resolution Authorizing a Contract with All Points of Texas for Moving Services Relating to Building Renovations

Monte Mercer, Deputy Executive Director, asked for authorization of a contract with All Points of Texas, in an amount not to exceed \$300,000, for moving and temporary storage services to logistically support the planned NCTCOG building renovations and the workforce center renovations.

Upon a Motion by Mayor McCowan (seconded by Judge Whitley), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the resolution as presented.

Item 5 Resolution Authorizing a Contract with SHI International Corp. for the Purchase of Basemap Data, Licenses, and Related Services

Christy Williams, Director of 9-1-1 Programs, explained that the contract with SHI International Corp. is for basemap data, licenses and related services, in an amount not to exceed \$300,000, to complement 9-1-1's current GIS mapping data. The imagery will be utilized in all 9-1-1 Program Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) by County 9-1-1 Addressing Authorities and by internal 9-1-1 GIS operations. The contract includes 250 licenses and continuous updates for five years.

Upon a Motion by Judge Clark (seconded by Councilmember Lombard), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the resolution as presented.

Item 6 Resolution Endorsing Request for a Secondary Safety Answering Point (SSAP)

Christy Williams, Director of 9-1-1 Programs, asked the Board to endorse and authorize an agreement with LifeCare Emergency Medical Services (EMS) for a Secondary Safety Answering Point (SSAP) utilizing available funds and existing vendors for equipment and network installation. She explained the Commission on State Emergency Communications (CSEC) requires NCTCOG to provide a resolution of endorsement in order to consider a request to add a Secondary Safety Answering Point. LifeCare EMS is a division of the Parker County Hospital District, a non-profit organization, and the sole EMS provider for Parker County. They receive 9-1-1 calls from Parker County Sheriff's Office, Springtown Police Department, Weatherford Police Department, and seven surrounding county Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs), which are all a part of NCTCOG's 9-1-1 area. Calls are currently answered on an administrative telephone line system with no Automatic Location Identification (ALI) or Automatic Number Identification (ANI) information.

Upon a Motion by Councilmember Wilemon (seconded by Councilmember Lombard), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the resolution as presented.

Item 7 Resolution Authorizing A Contract With Burns & McDonnell Engineering Company, Inc. For A Regional Recycling Survey And Campaign

Edith Marvin, Director of Environment and Development, explained that this project will identify and provide a data collection process and tracking tool for the residential recycling rates of member governments. The data will be used to develop and support a Regional Recycling Educational Campaign that promotes a mutual, consistent message to the region regarding common recyclables. The project will engage the cooperation of local Material Recovery Facilities (MRF) and other stakeholders to improve recycling participation, decrease recycling contamination and educate the public to "recycle more and recycle right". A selection committee recommended Burns & McDonnell Engineering Company, Inc. for this project in an amount not to exceed \$300,000.

Item 8 Resolution Authorizing Agreements with Subrecipients of the Clean Fleets North Texas 2018 Call For Projects

Michael Morris, Director of Transportation, asked for authorization for agreements for five applications that were received by the deadline. He explained that available funding for Clean Fleets North Texas projects includes approximately \$1.5 million from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) National Clean Diesel Funding Assistance Program and approximately \$48,000 from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP). Additional TCEQ Supplemental Environmental Project funds are designated for the North Central Texas Clean School Bus Program.

Item 9 Resolution Authorizing Agreements for the 511DFW/Waze Data Sharing and the Traffic Signal Data Sharing Programs

Michael Morris, Director of Transportation, asked the Board to authorize agreements for selected applicants in the following two grant programs.

The Traffic Signal Data Sharing Program

The Regional Transportation Council (RTC) approved subawards to six applicants to provide assistance for local entities to make their traffic signal data accessible to the developer community to power in-vehicle applications that assist travelers. Projects funded through the Traffic Signal Data Sharing Program will utilize up to \$125,000 of Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) funds and 25,000 Transportation Development Credits in lieu of local match.

The 511DFW/Waze Data Sharing Program

The RTC approved subawards to eight applicants to provide assistance for local entities to share road closure and other pertinent information with travel navigation services such as Waze, Google Maps and Inrix so that applications can route users around traffic trouble spots. Projects funded through the 511DFW/Waze Data Sharing Program will use up to \$114,400 Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program funds and \$28,600 in State Match.

Item 10 Resolution Endorsing Submittal of a Grant Application to the United States Department of Transportation

Councilmember Kleinman and Judge Self left the meeting.

Michael Morris, Director of Transportation, explained that the Regional Transportation Council (RTC) approved the submission of a grant application for a total of approximately \$50 million in funding, under the United States Department of Transportation (US DOT) 2018 Advanced Transportation and Congestion Management Technologies Deployment (ATCMTD) Initiative, on June 14, 2018. The application was for approximately \$50 million total (\$10 million US DOT + \$20 million Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program + \$20 million Local Initiative Projects funding from Clean Air Account No. 151). The ATCMTD is a nationwide competitive grant program for the development of large-scale installation and operation of advanced transportation technologies to improve safety, efficiency, system performance, and infrastructure return on investment. The application includes the following components:

- Implement an integrated information hub for transportation-related information.
- Test technology within corridors that will improve environmental quality and roadway/bicycle/pedestrian safety and increase traveler satisfaction by reducing congestion and improving reliability.
- Collect and archive information to improve performance measures and evaluate transportation system operations to identify locations that may benefit from technology enhancements.

Item 11 Resolution Endorsing Mobility 2045: The Metropolitan Transportation Plan for North Central Texas and Associated 2018 Transportation Conformity

Michael Morris, Director of Transportation, explained that the Regional Transportation Council (RTC) approved Mobility 2045: The Metropolitan Transportation Plan for North Central Texas (Mobility 2045) and the 2018 Transportation Conformity on June 14, 2018. Mobility 2045 is the long-range, multimodal transportation plan that guides the expenditure of federal and state funds for transportation projects in North Central Texas. NCTCOG staff worked with the public, transportation partners, and elected officials to prepare this transportation plan. The results of air quality conformity analysis in the 2018 Transportation Conformity demonstrate successful passing of the motor vehicle emissions budgets test and are consistent with the air quality goals of the State Implementation Plan, as required by the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act and the Clean Air Act (FAST Act). The FAST Act assigns the MPO (RTC) the responsibility for carrying out the transportation conformity process in cooperation with the state and operators of publicly owned transit services.

Item 12 Resolution Endorsing the 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program for North Central Texas

Michael Morris, Director of Transportation, explained that the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a staged, multi-year program of projects approved for funding by federal, State, and local sources within the Dallas-Fort Worth area. Every two years, NCTCOG develops a new TIP in cooperation with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), local governments, and transportation agencies. The projects in the 2019-2022 TIP are consistent with Mobility 2045: The Metropolitan Transportation Plan for North Central Texas and the resulting air quality conformity analysis. The Regional Transportation Council (RTC) approved the TIP at its May 10, 2018 meeting.

As specified in the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2018, the BUILD Discretionary Grant Program is dedicated for surface transportation projects expected to have a significant local or regional impact. The Notice of Funding Opportunity indicated availability of \$1.5 billion nationwide for the BUILD Discretionary Grant Program in 2018, and final applications were due by July 19, 2018. The following projects were submitted: 1) IH 635 LBJ East, 2) Trinity Railway Express (TRE) Multimodal Improvements, and 3) AllianceTexas/Haslet Accessibility Improvement Project.

The Regional Transportation Council approved the submission of the projects to the US DOT under the BUILD Discretionary Grant Program on July 12, 2018. Staff is requesting endorsement of the BUILD grant applications. If awarded, staff will work with the US DOT on the most efficient method to transfer these funds to the region.

Item Title: Resolution Authorizing a Contract Amendment with United Road Towing

Texas, Inc. for Wrecker Services on SH 161

In September 2016, the Executive Board approved a Contract with United Road Towing Texas, Inc. for a bottleneck improvement for State Highway (SH) 161 between Belt Line Road and SH 183 in Irving. The contract was for one year with four one year optional renewals. This improvement consisted of shoulder restriping to enable three lanes of traffic during peak travel periods. The additional capacity provides congestion relief for travelers within and adjacent to this three-mile section. A key component to successfully utilize the shoulder is the staging of tow trucks to respond quickly to incidents and to provide the additional daily services required for opening and closing the shoulder. These services include conducting a sweep of the shoulder for debris or vehicles prior to the lane opening, notifying TxDOT with confirmation the lanes are clear and ready to be opened, and coordinating with courtesy patrols on any motorist assistance incidents during the lanes operational periods.

The project is located within the City of Irving and the city ordinance requires the Irving Police Department to dispatch its contracted wrecker service provider, United Road Towing Texas, Inc. The City included the scope of services to stage and operate the SH 161 pilot project into its procurement and has requested the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) enter into an agreement directly with URT in order to pay for these services.

Executive Board approval will be requested to amend the contract with United Road Towing Texas, Inc., in an amount of \$75,000 (\$60,000 Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) funds and \$15,000 state match provided by TxDOT, for a revised not to exceed amount of \$375,000, to continue tow truck operations in the corridor.

WHEREAS, the interim bottleneck improvement for SH 161 between Belt Line Road and SH 183 in Irving will continue to be open to traffic, whereby the inside shoulder is restriped to enable three lanes of traffic during the peak periods to provide additional capacity and congestion relief during the peak periods; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Irving conducted a competitive procurement in 2016 for wrecker services and auto pound operation and selected United Road Towing (URT) Texas, Inc. as the authorized wrecker service required for any City of Irving dispatched tow requests; and,

WHEREAS, in September 2016, the Executive Board approved a Contract with URT Texas, Inc. for Wrecker Services on SH161; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary to continue implementation of bottleneck improvements to provide quick response and removal of incidents along the State Highway 161 corridor and therefore necessary to continue tow truck operations; and,

WHEREAS, under Local Government Code Chapter 252, the Executive Board has authority to amend contracts by up to 25 percent without undergoing additional procurement activities.

1) The original plan included the purchase of desktop and network equipment through Dell and SHI in the amount of \$930,000 and the purchase of network equipment and maintenance through Flair Data Systems and GDT in the amount of \$170,000. Actual activity this year will result in fewer purchase from Dell and SHI and more from Flair Data Systems. The purpose of this item is to modify the authorization for purchases from Dell, SHI and Flair as follows:

Dell and SHI – decrease by	-\$230,000
Flair Data Systems – increase by	\$230,000
Net change	\$0

2) The original plan included expenditures up to \$510,000 for consulting, upgrade and migration of Microsoft foundation technologies used at the Agency. Projects to replace retired Microsoft software related to the phone system, and increases in storage requirement necessitating an expansion of backup system capabilities, require \$150,000 be spent with either DataVox, EST Group or Freeit, instead of the original plan. This will result in a modification of the original authorization as follows:

Planet Technologies – decrease by -\$150,000
DataVox, EST Group, Freeit – increase by \$150,000
Net change \$0

These changes are required to account for additional activities related to network connectivity and backup, and less for server, consulting, and software activity for the year. The Executive Board will be asked to approve the modification of the purchase of computer hardware, software and related services authorization approved in October 2017 as indicated above.

Item Title: Resolution Authorizing a New Lease for the Stephenville Workforce Center

The current Workforce Center in Stephenville is located at 2165 West South Loop. The current lease is for a one (1) year period which expires on July 31, 2018. This lease contains 3,000 square feet at a price of \$12.80 per square foot (excluding utilities and janitorial amounts).

The Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) has a current office lease for its Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) staff in Stephenville which is set to expire in April 2021. As previously discussed with Board members, the VR staff will eventually integrate within all of the Workforce Centers. To effectively plan for a smooth transition of the projected four (4) Stephenville VR staff into our workforce center, it would be prudent to negotiate a workforce center lease extension in Stephenville to be co-terminus with the Stephenville VR lease end date.

Donald Peacock (landlord) has agreed to a new thirty-three (33) month lease for the current Workforce Center facility at a price per square foot equal to the previous rate, \$12.80 (excluding utilities and janitorial amounts) to begin August 1, 2018. Mr. Peacock has also agreed to include an expansion option within the lease for 1,200 square feet of space adjacent to our existing facility which could potentially be utilized to accommodate the VR staff currently planned to integrate within our workforce center in May 2021.

Our real estate broker, Avison Young, has performed a current market survey of other comparable properties (Please see Exhibit A) and discovered that the proposed rate for this facility is well within the market price for that surrounding area. This is still an optimum location for the Stephenville Workforce Center due to the pricing, close proximity to major roads and thorough fares, and adequate parking.

A draft resolution authorizing a new lease for the Stephenville Workforce Center is attached for the Executive Board's consideration. A brief presentation of this item will be made prior to requesting Board approval.

Item Title: Annual Meeting and Orientation of the North Central Texas Council of Governments

Foundation, Inc.

The purpose of this item is to hold an annual meeting of North Central Texas Council of Governments Foundation, Inc., (Foundation) and provide an orientation to the members of the Board on the activities and status of the Foundation.

In 2002, the Executive Board of the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) authorized the creation of a non-profit corporation, the North Central Texas Council of Governments Foundation, Inc., which is a 501(c)(3) organization. The purpose of the Foundation is to supplement NCTCOG activities in order to provide broader service opportunities to NCTCOG's constituents and the North Central Texas region. For example, the NCTCOG Foundation has been utilized in the past to apply for and receive grant funding that requires a 501(c)(3) status from both public and private sector entities. The Foundation has no employees and is managed and operated by NCTCOG staff.

The Executive Board of NCTCOG serves as the Board of the Foundation. The officers of the Executive Board (President, Vice-President, and Secretary/Treasurer) serve as officers of the Foundation. The Foundation must comply with the Texas Open Meetings and Public Information Act. The Foundation is authorized to create committees as necessary to assist in management, policy direction, and oversight. The Bylaws outline authorized and prohibited transactions, indemnification provisions of directors, officers, and employees, and financial management of the Foundation.

I will brief the Board and be available to respond to any questions the Board may have.
