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Bachman Area Community Transportation Needs Survey Report

North Central Texas Council of Governments- April 2021

To better understand the community transportation needs of residents connected to <u>Bachman Lake Area Planning Study</u> the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) and the National Parks Service Rivers, Trails, and Conservation Assistance Program in partnership with the City of Dallas opened an online Google Forms survey to the public on October 26, 2020 through February 28, 2021. This report shows the complete set of responses for a total of 391 responses received. The survey was made in available in English, Spanish, and Korean, however no responses were received on the Korean form. The survey included 18 questions with a mix of multiple choice and open-ended text responses.

The tables in this report include the number and percent of responses for the set multiple choice answer options. Questions requiring a written response were divided into common themes. Those themes were interpreted by NCTCOG staff out of the wide variation of responses to show patterns in feedback and are provided in tables with the number and percent of responses that were similar. Refer to Appendix 1 for written responses, provided verbatim.







Question #4: What changes, if any, would you support to the design of Northwest Highway/Loop 12 (NWHWY)?













Question #12: What destinations, new developments, retail and restaurant type spaces, and related general policies would you most like to see more of in the community in place of vacant land and buildings?







Figure 16.1: Concentration of Respondents by Zip Code

Question #18: Which of the following best describes your relationship to the Northwest Dallas / Bachman Lake / Love Field area?


