WHEREAS, the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) made funding available through the Federal-State Partnership for the State of Good Repair (SOGR) Program to repair, replace, or rehabilitate qualified railroad assets to reduce the state of good repair backlog and improve intercity passenger rail performance, with applications due by July 27, 2020; and,

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2020, the RTC endorsed the submittal of a grant application on behalf of Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART) and Trinity Metro for the Trinity Railway Express Corridor State of Good Repair Improvements Project for a total project cost of approximately \$58 million (\$28 million in SOGR federal funding, \$2 million in federal funding from the RTC, and \$28 million in local match from DART, Trinity Metro, and BNSF Railway) under the FRA's Federal-State Partnership for State of Good Repair Program.
