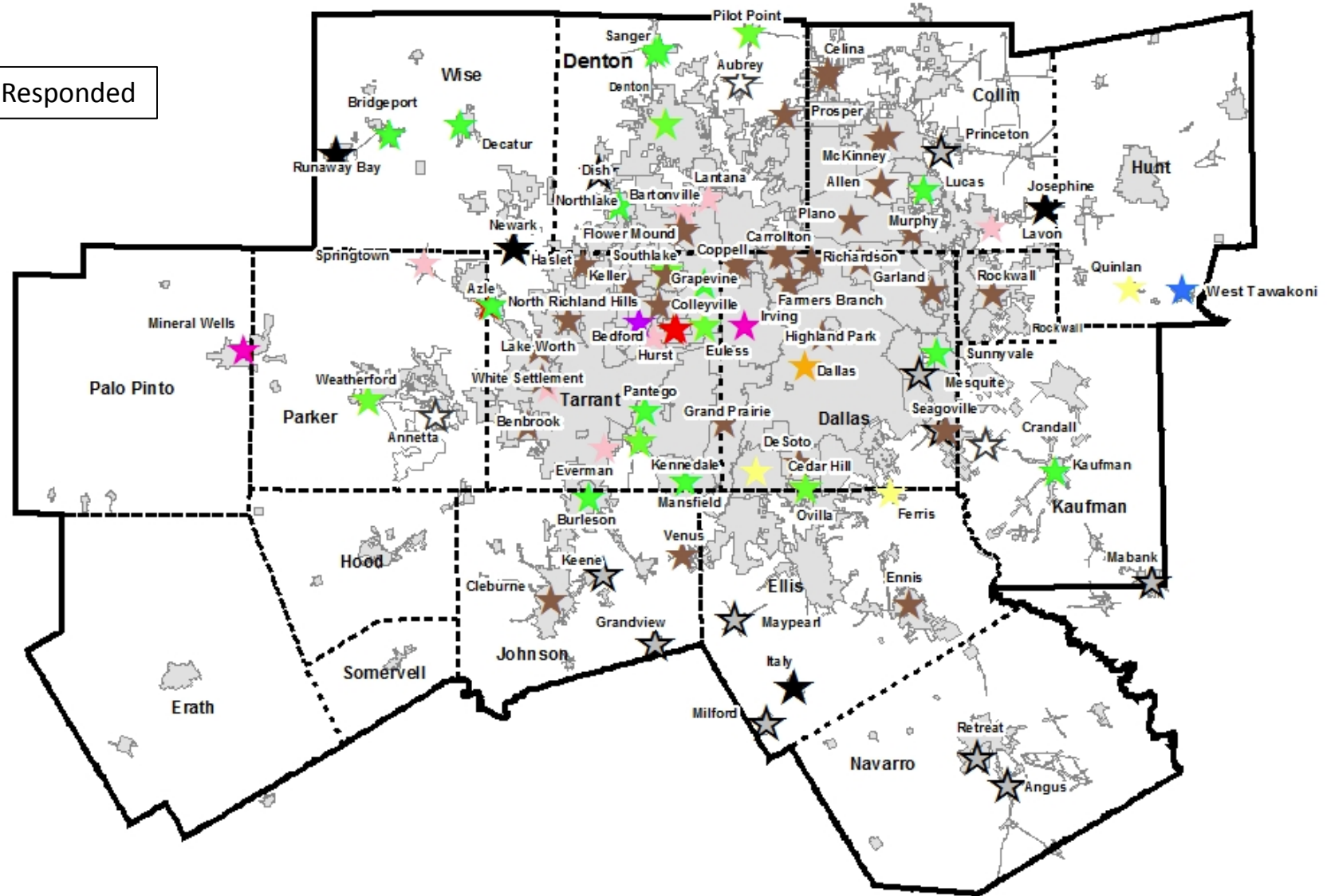

Cities Who Responded



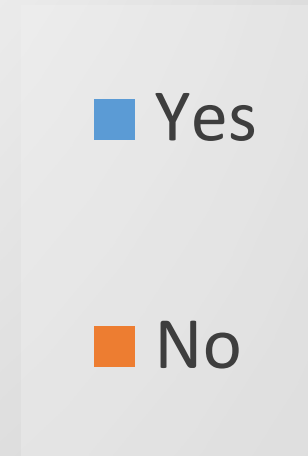
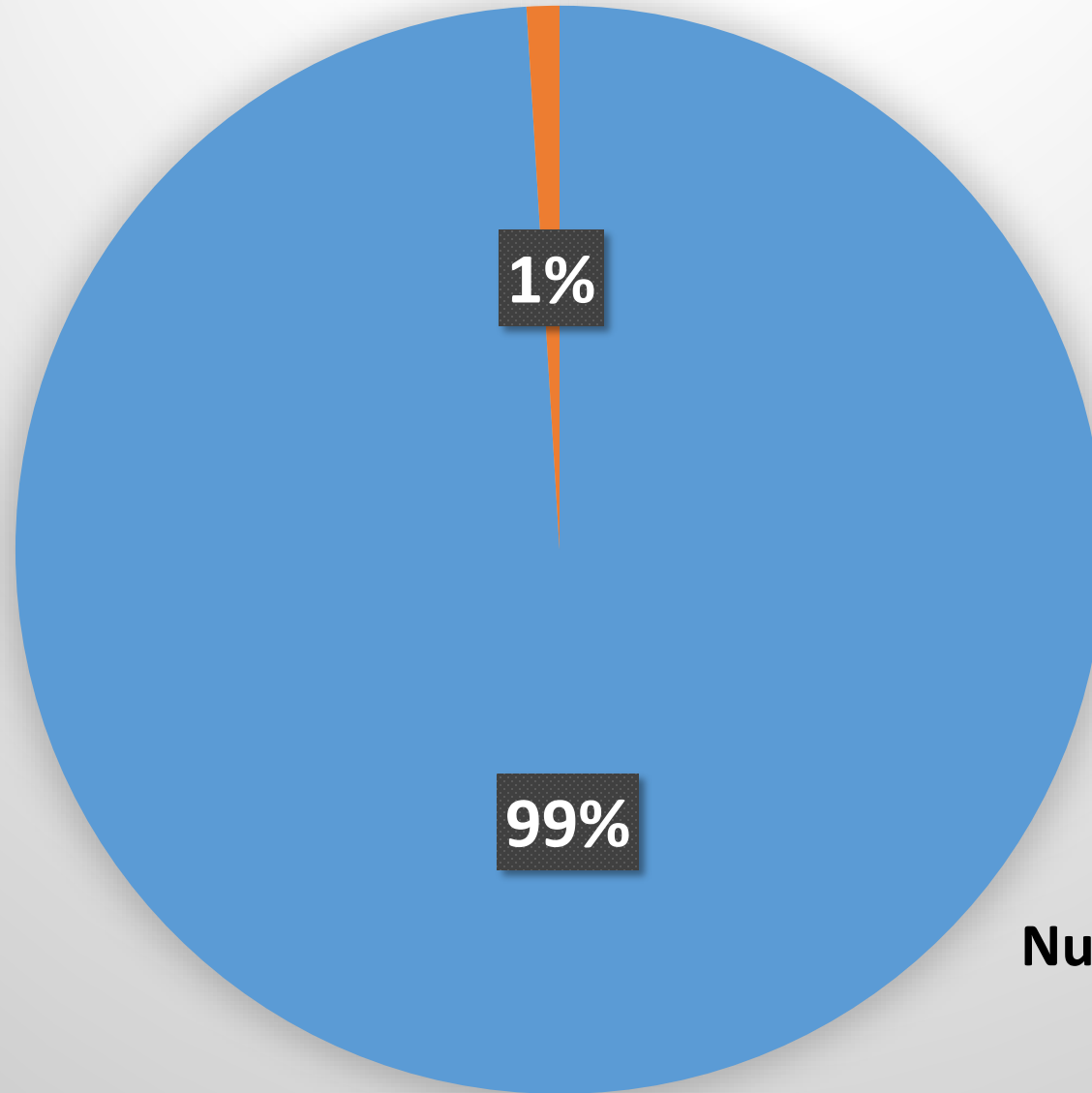

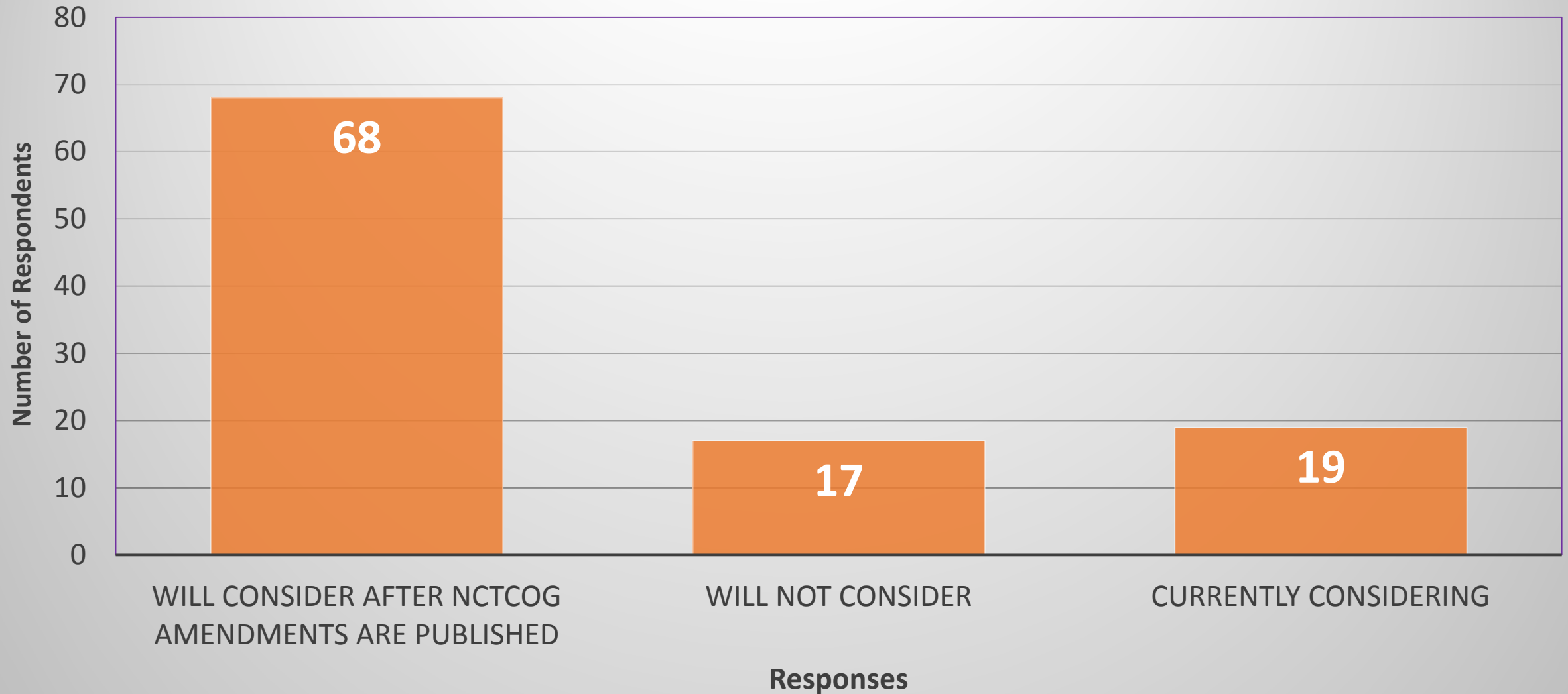
What is your city's code adoption schedule?



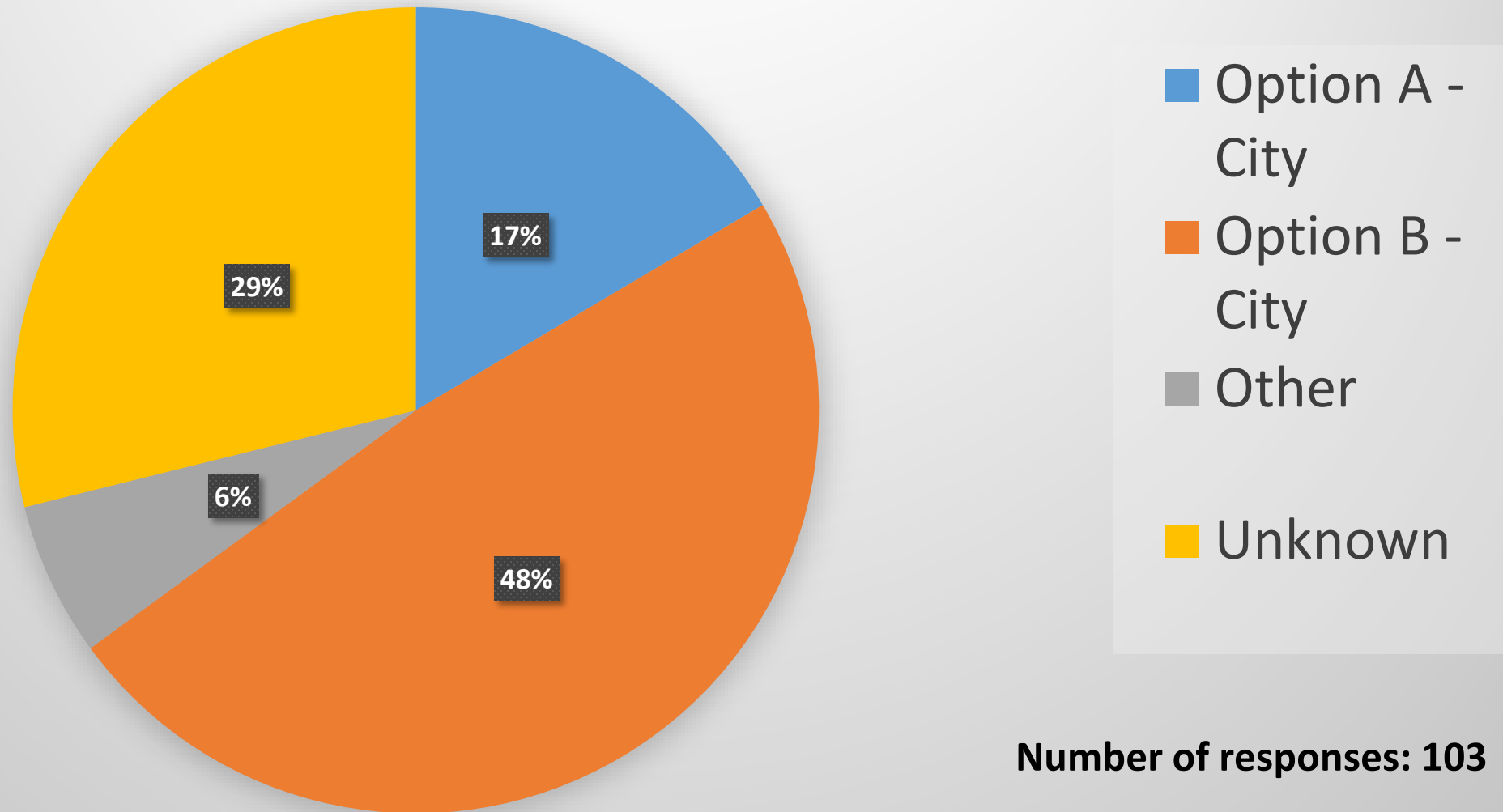

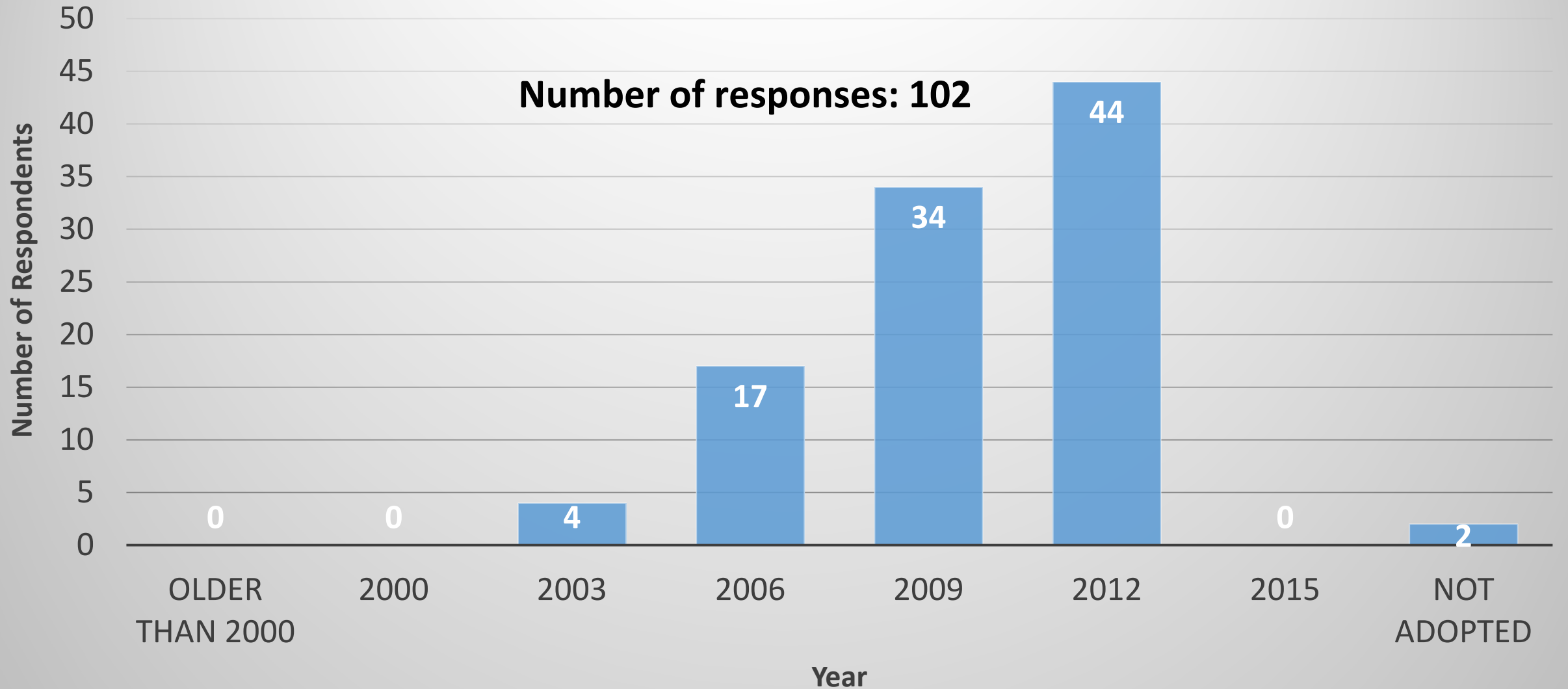
If adopting the International Building Codes or International Fire Code, is your city an Option A city or an Option B city?

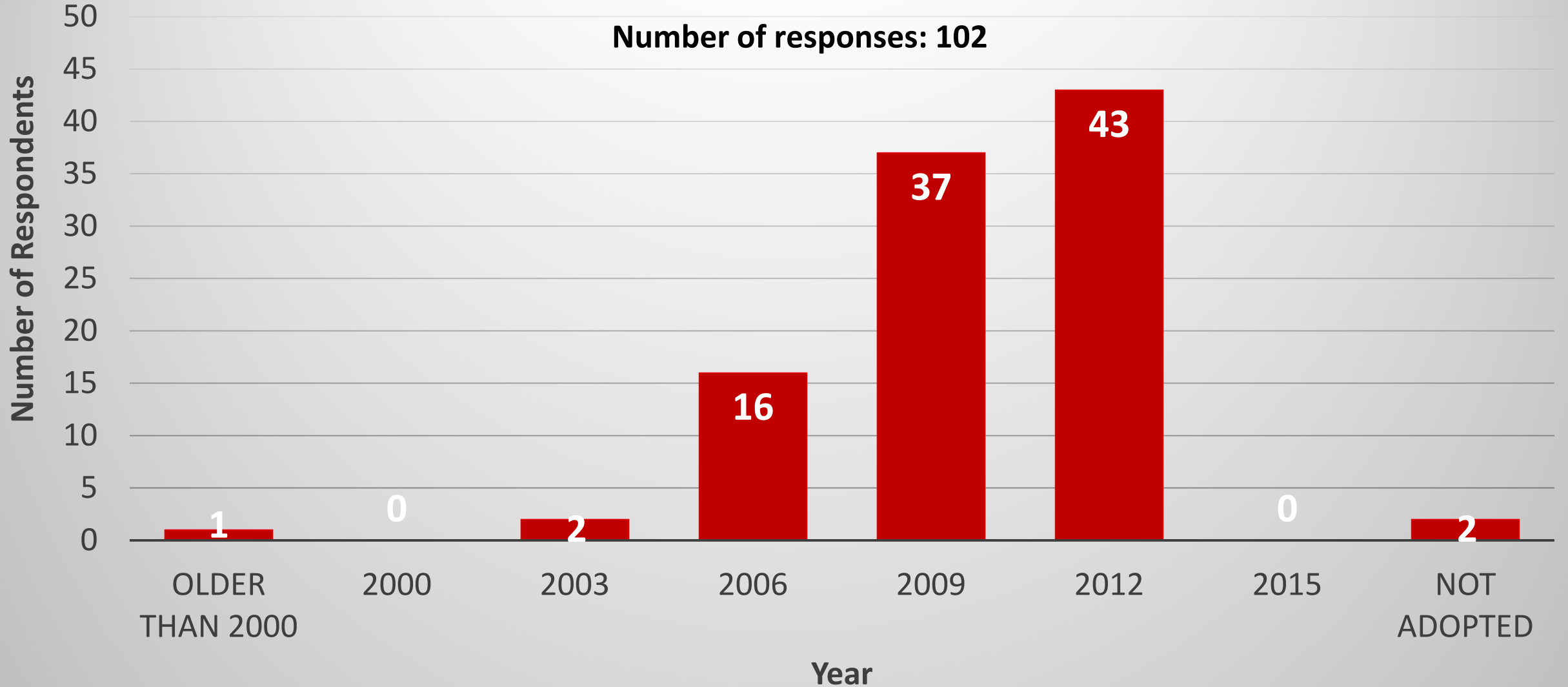

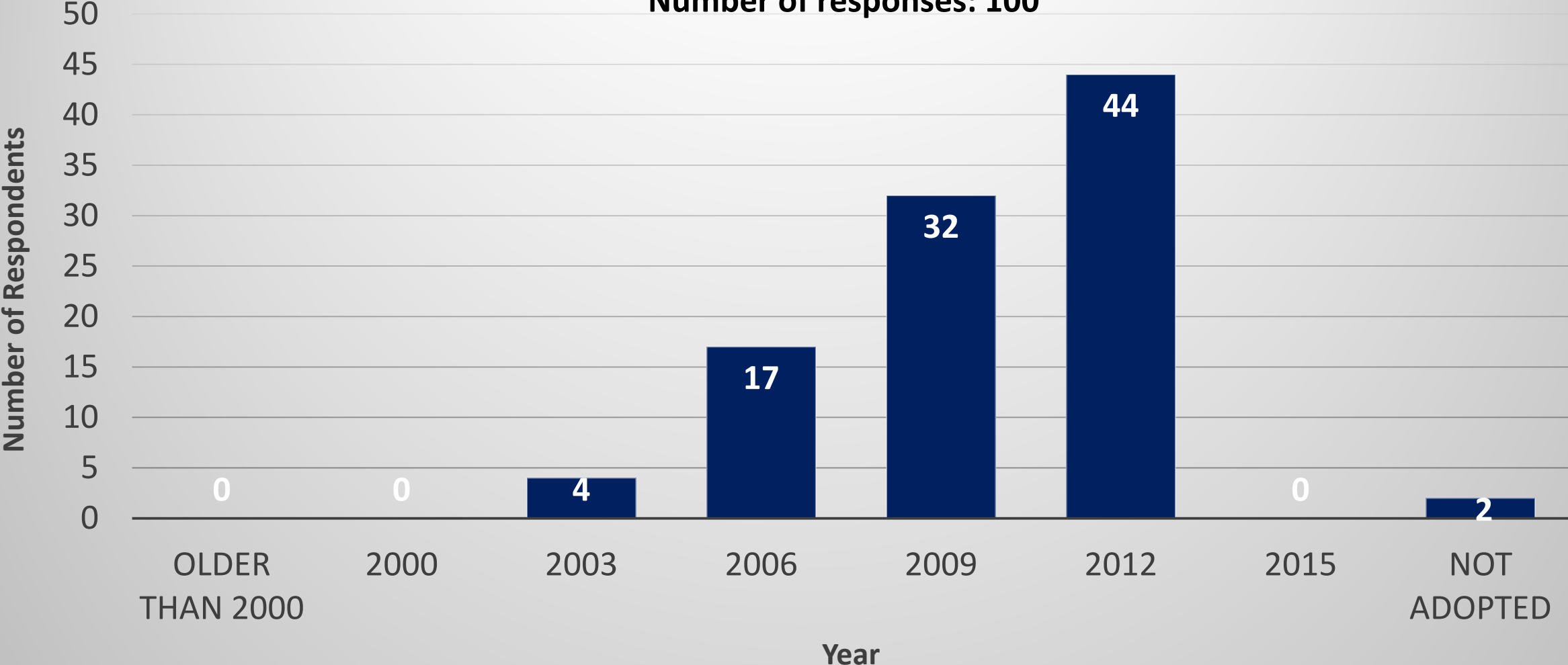

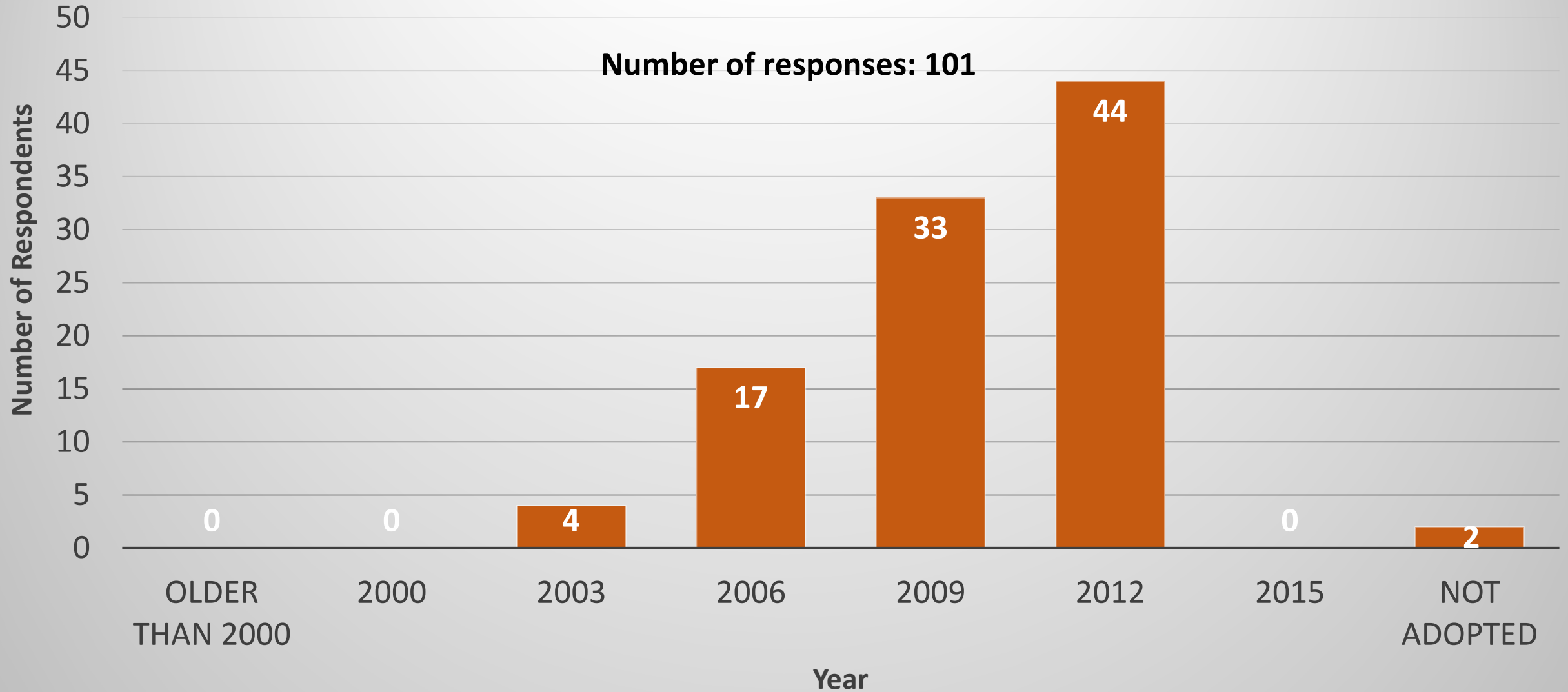

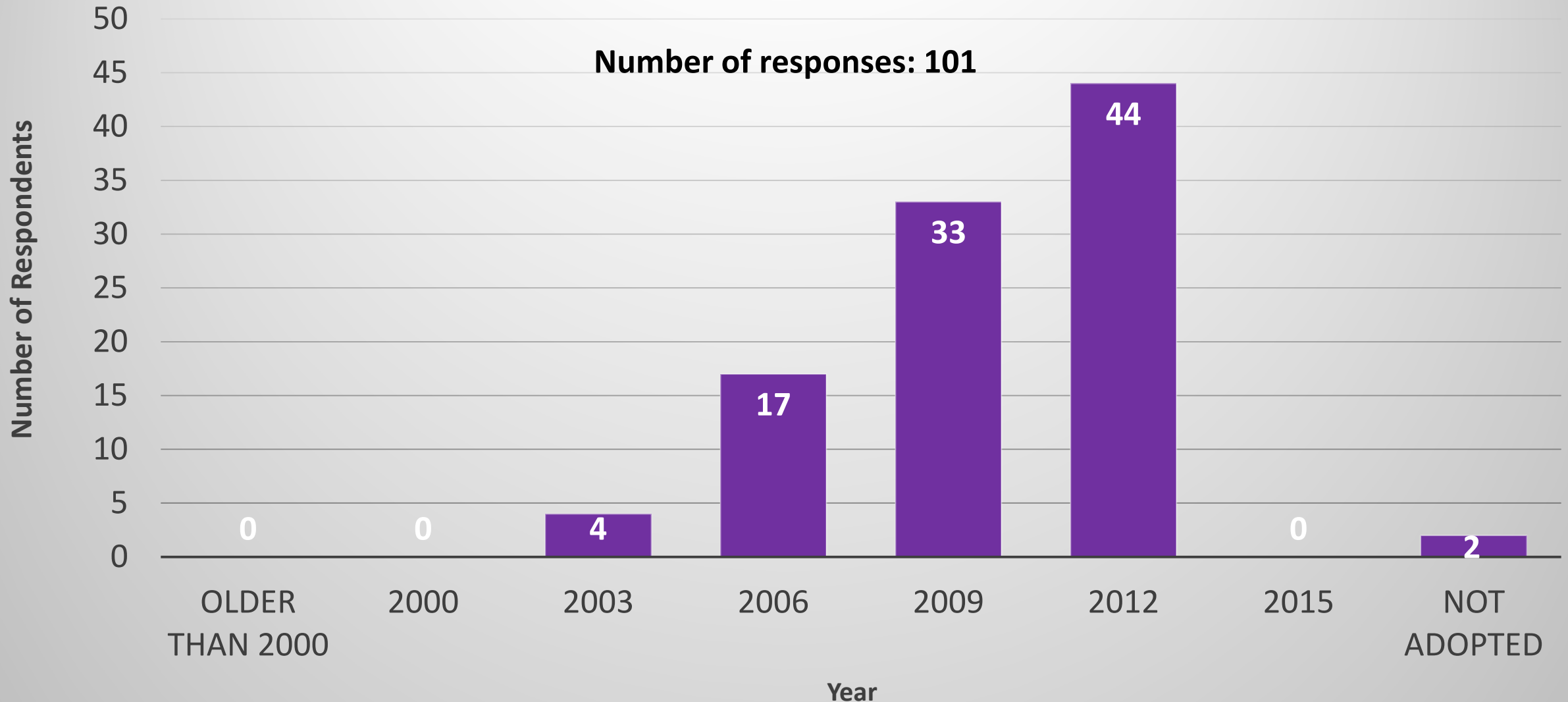

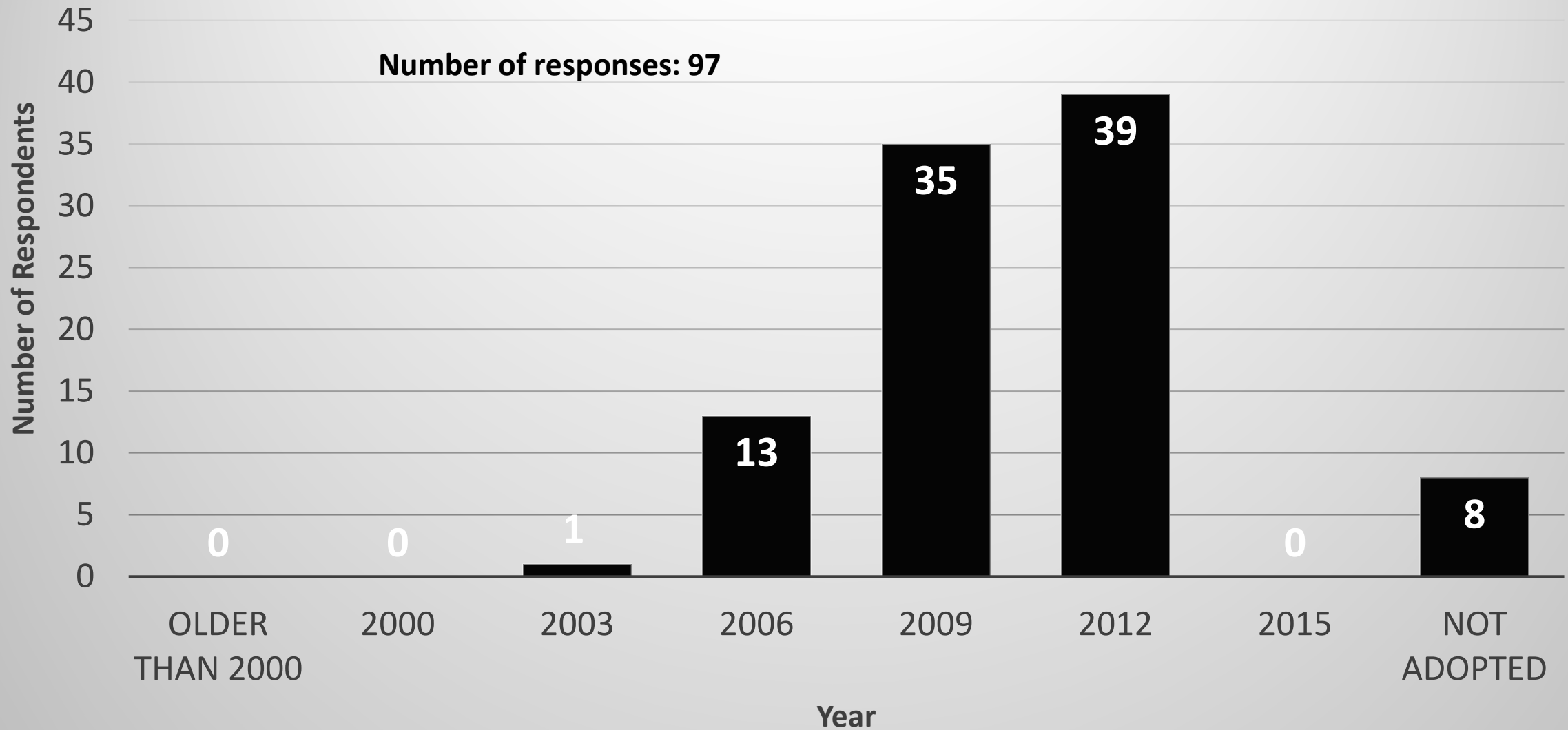

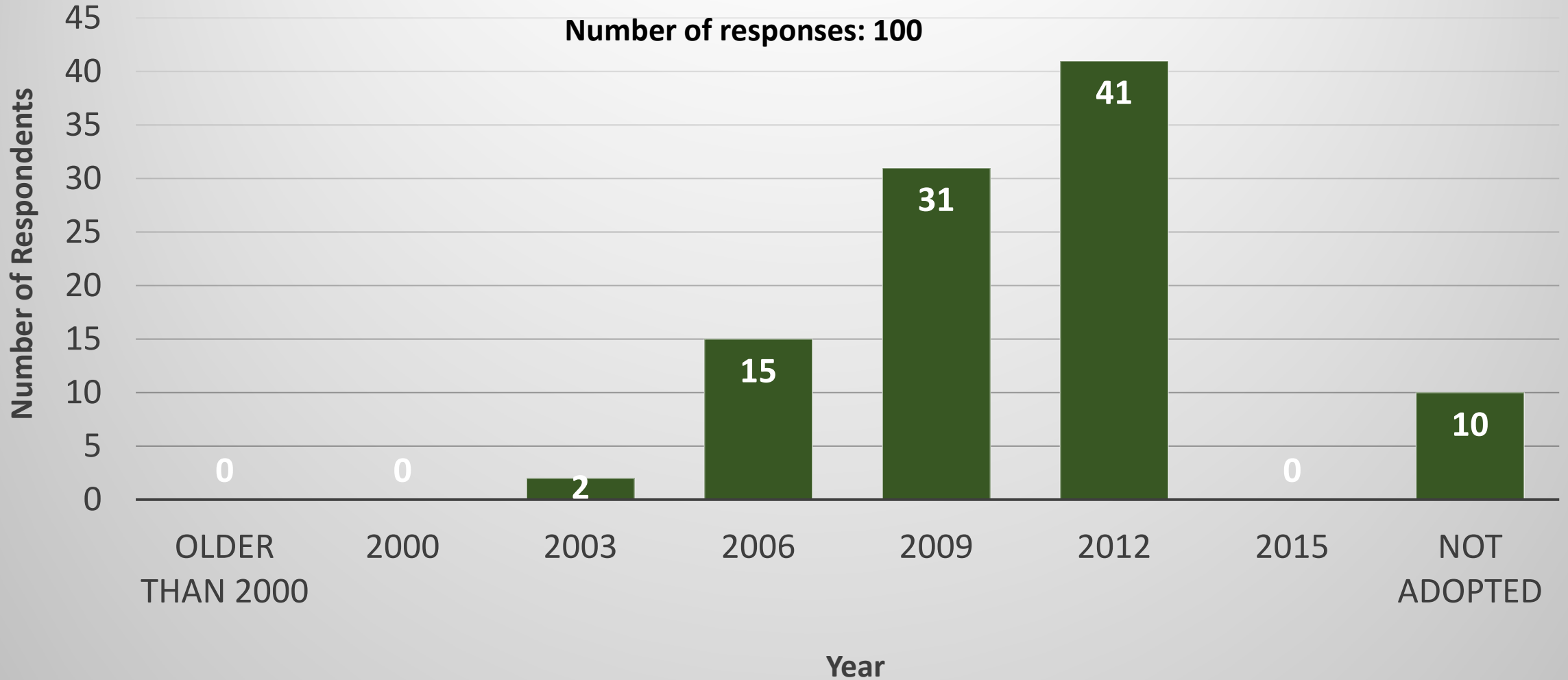

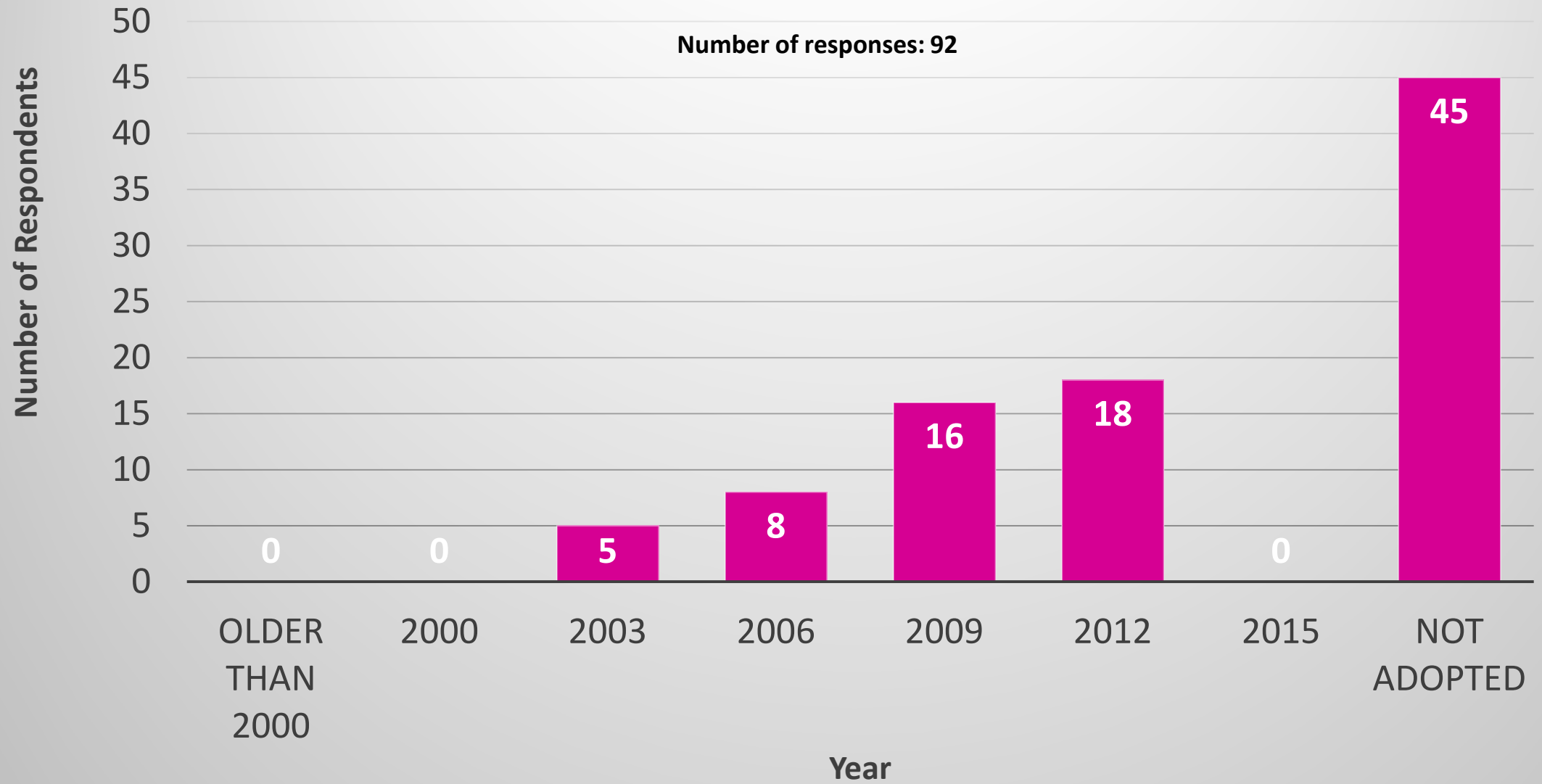

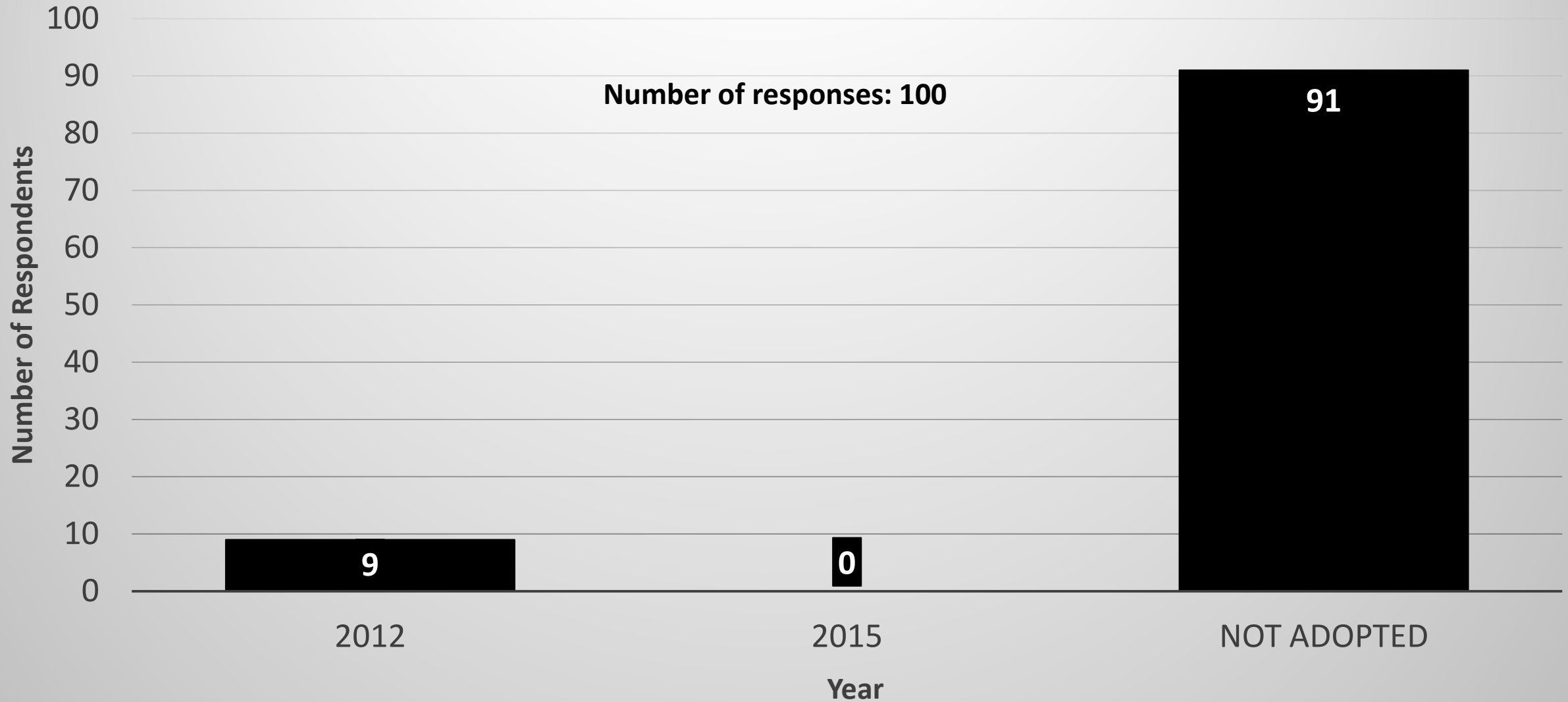

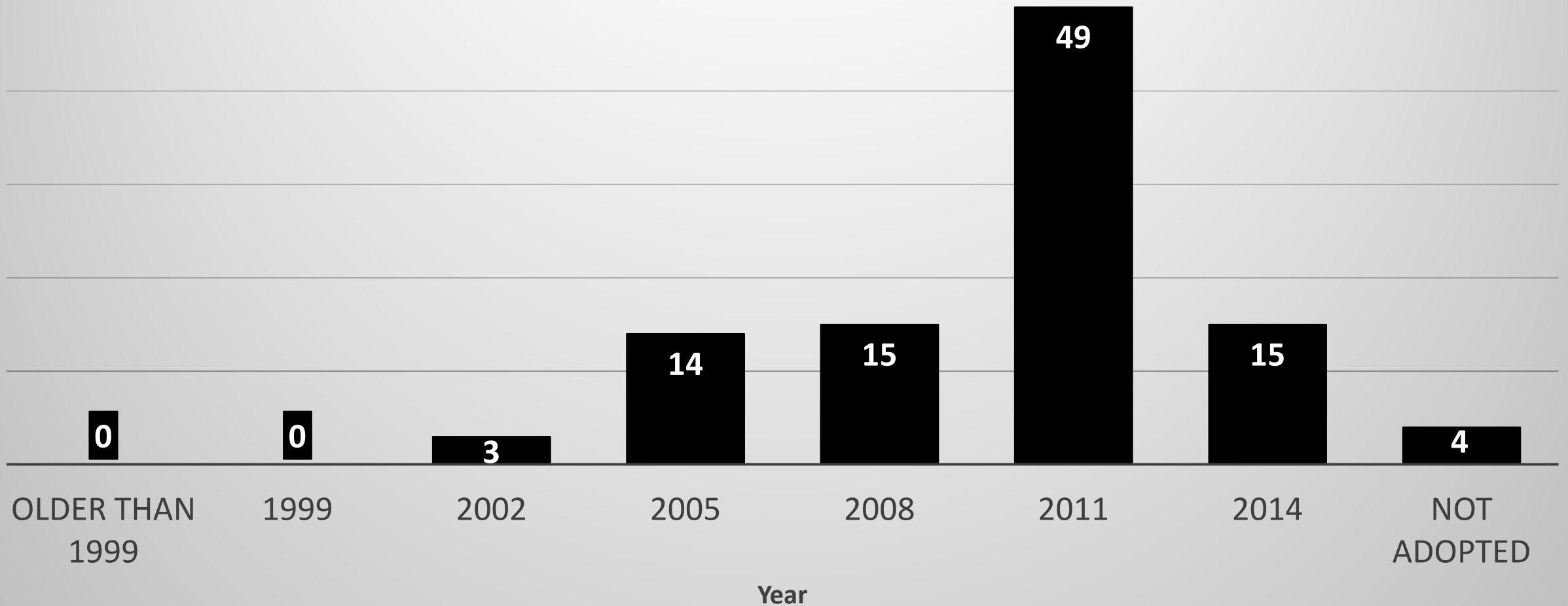

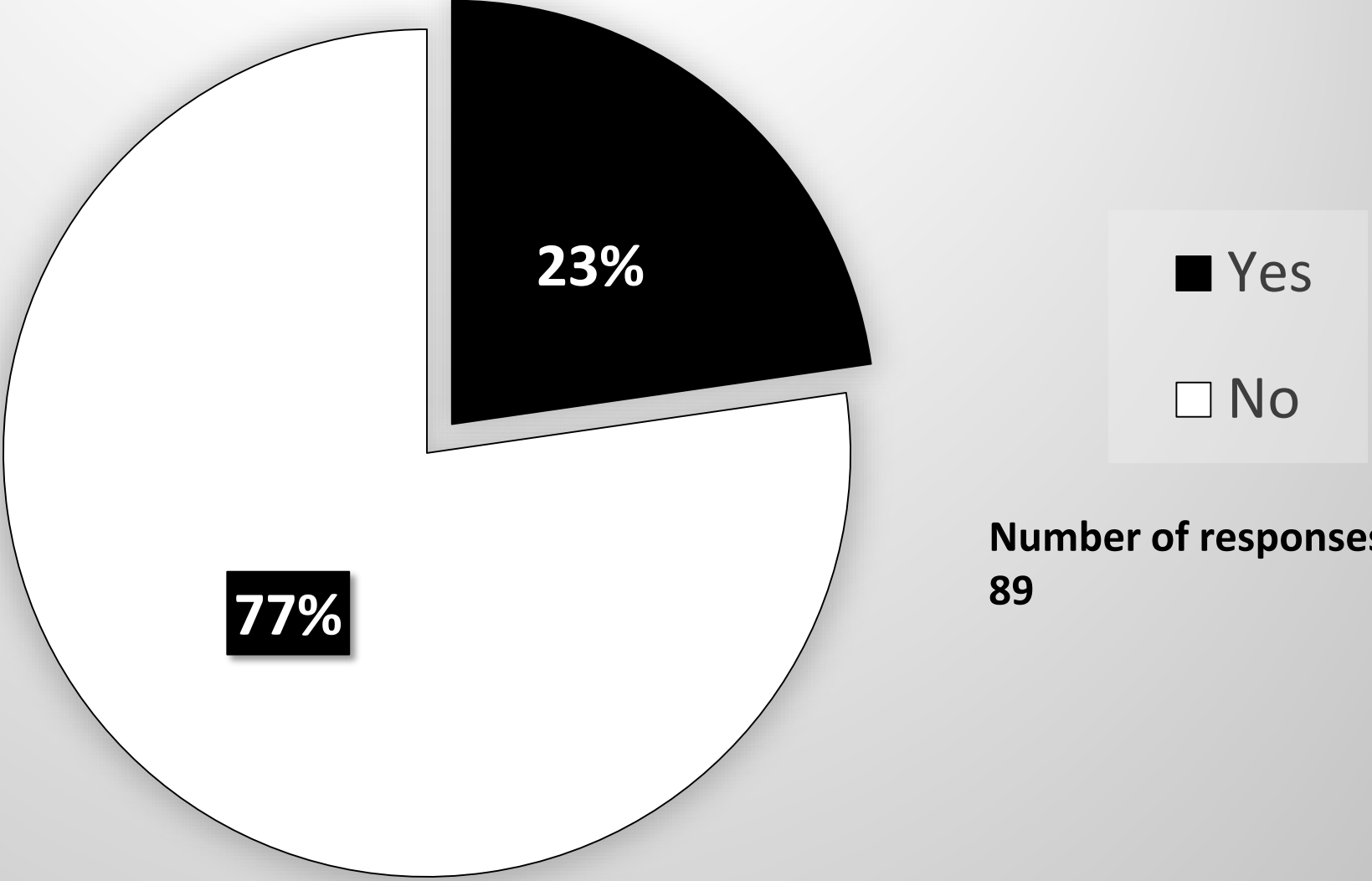


When your city adopts codes, does your city typically utilize amendments as presented by NCTCOG?
