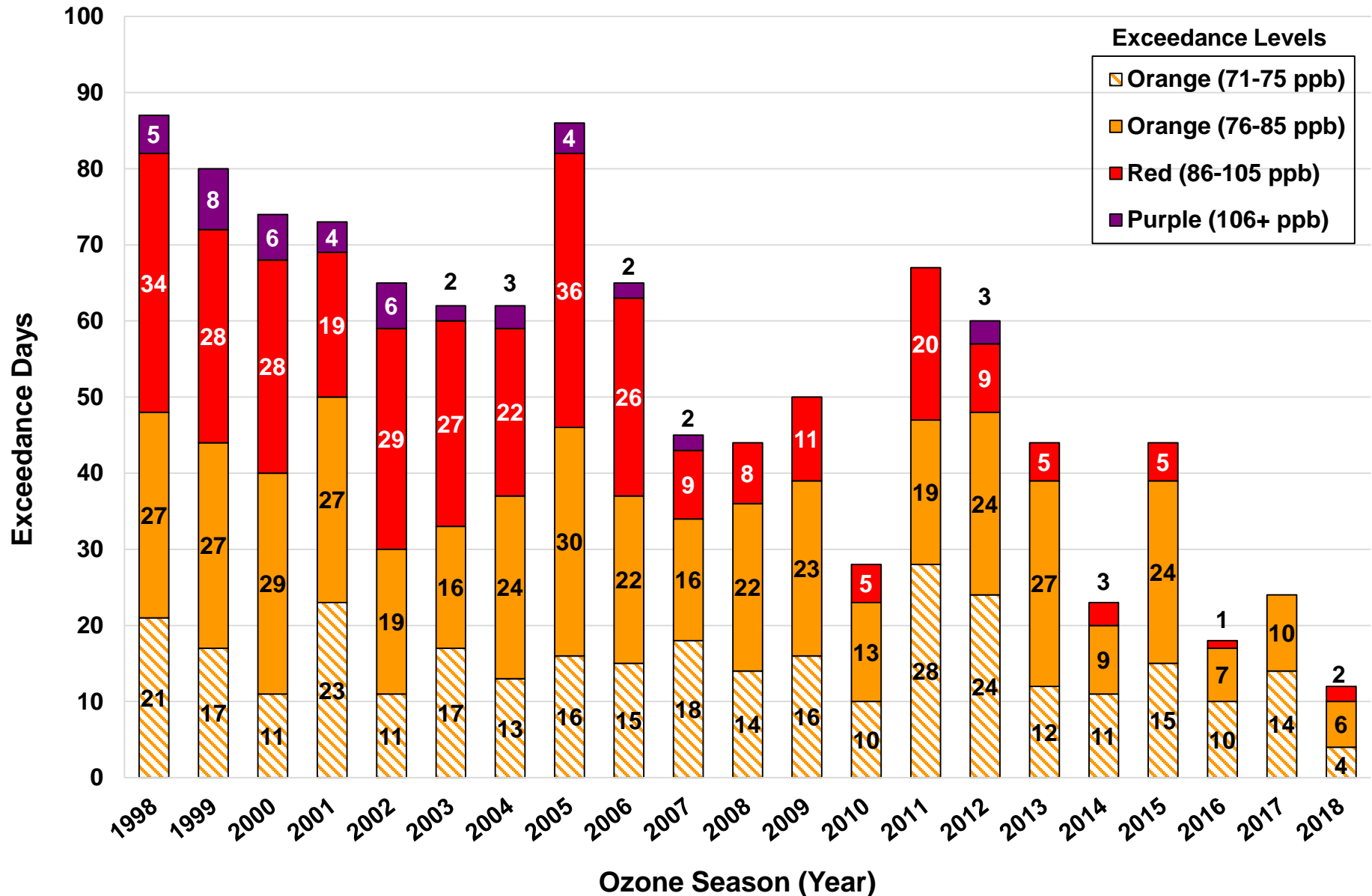

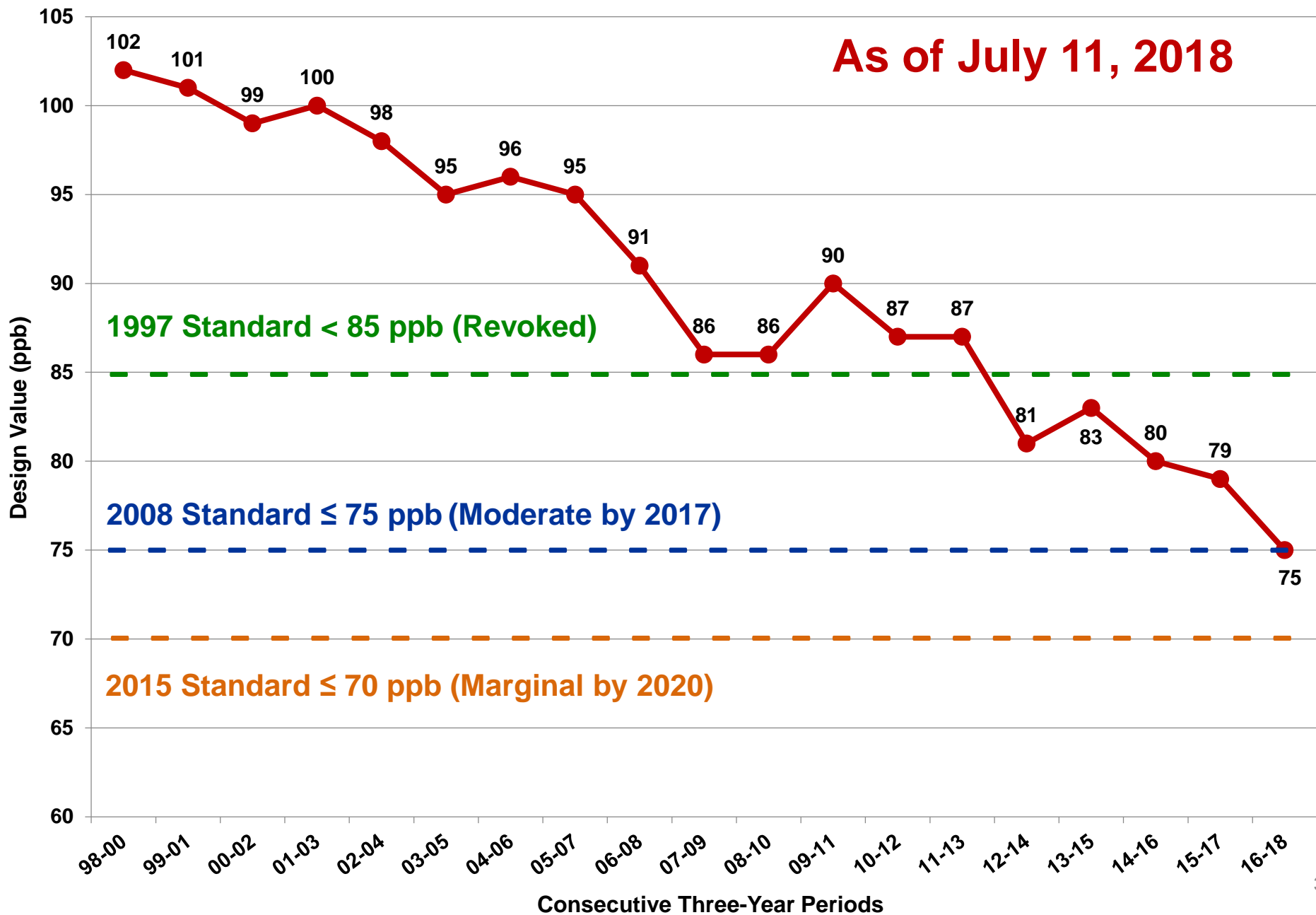
8-HOUR OZONE NAAQS HISTORICAL TRENDS

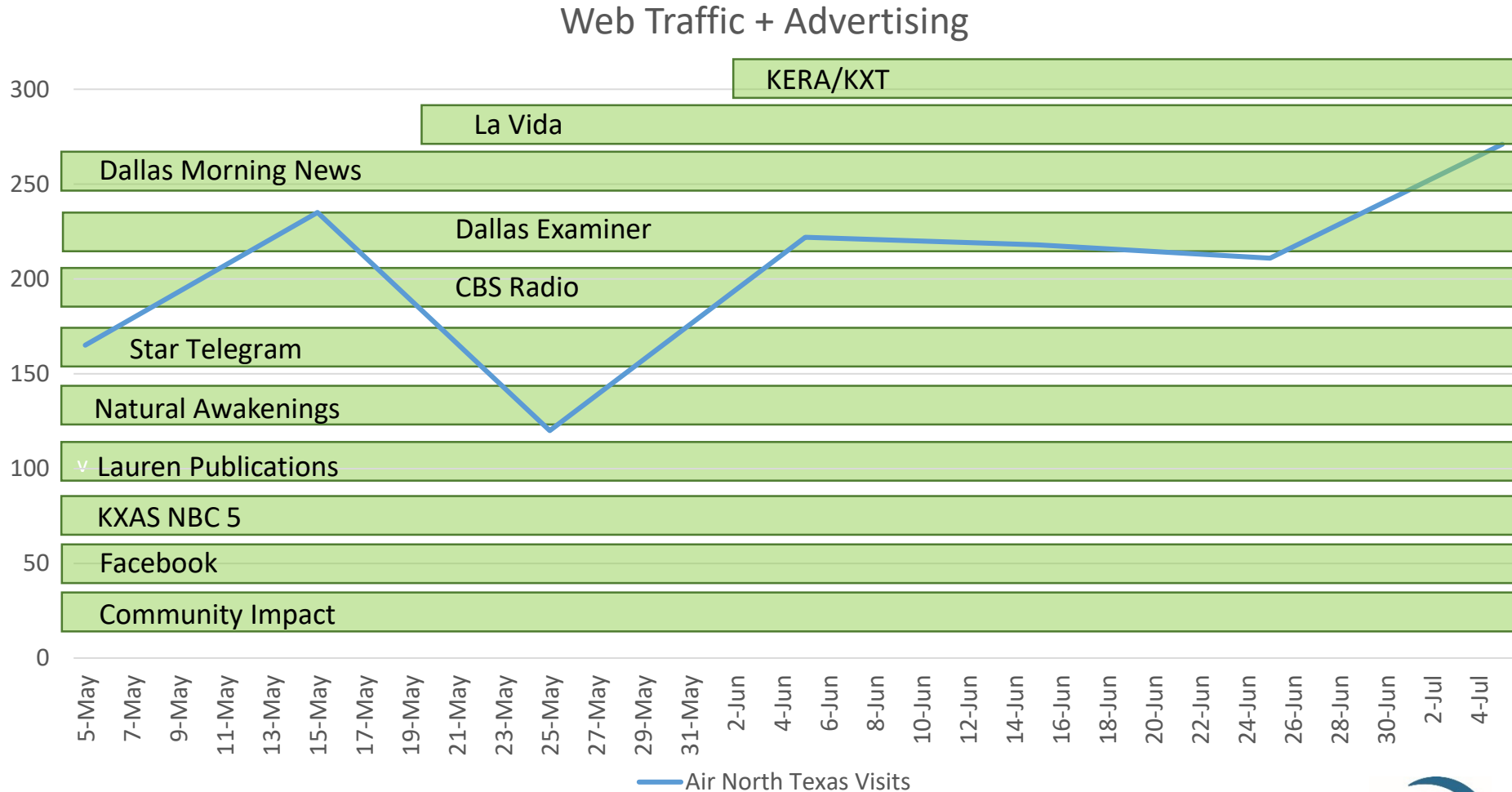

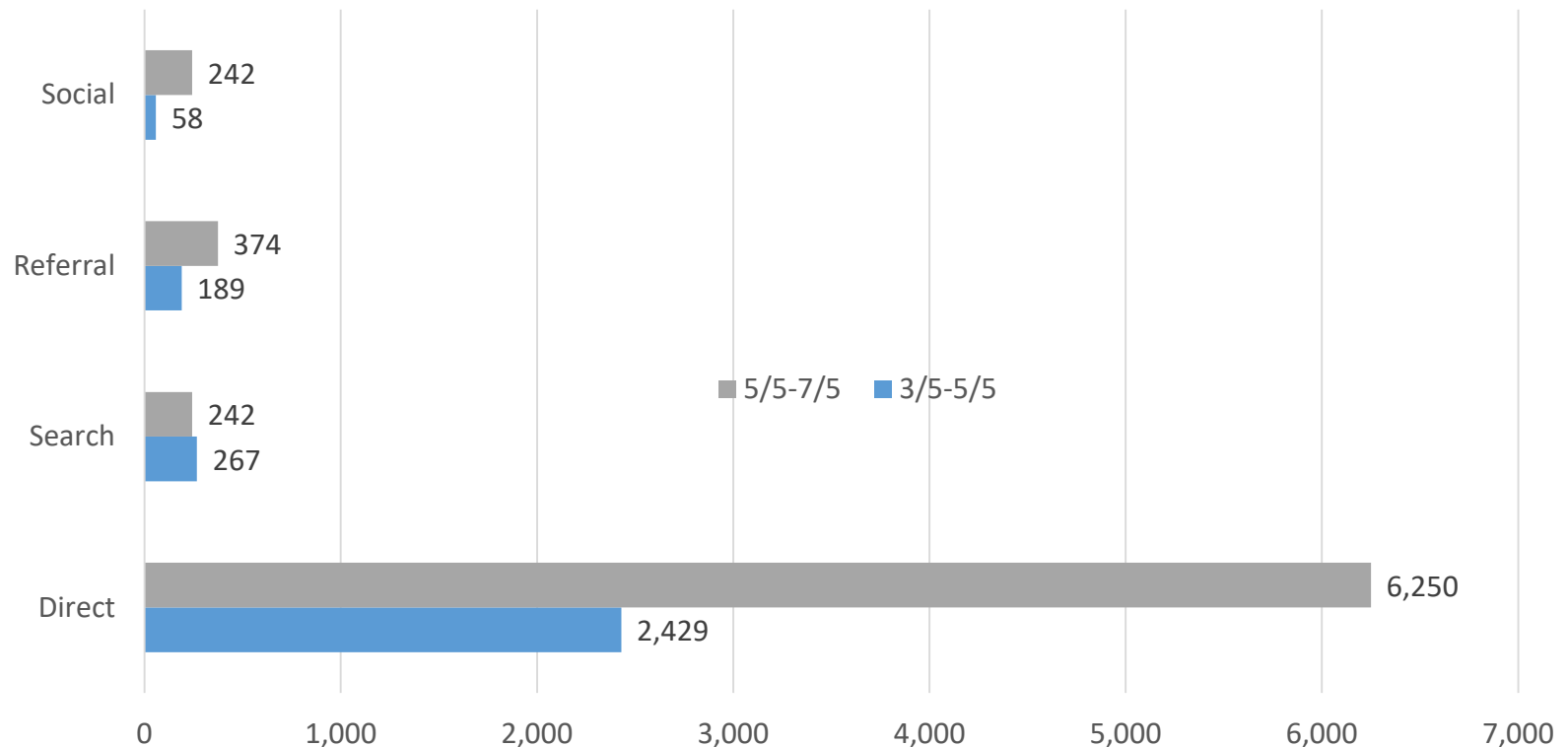

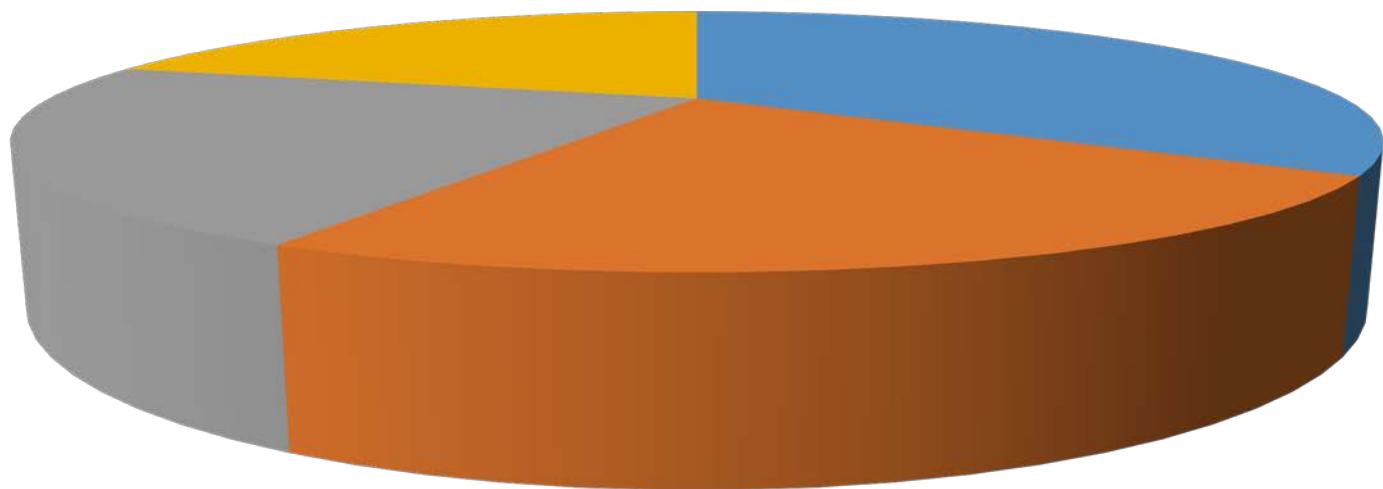

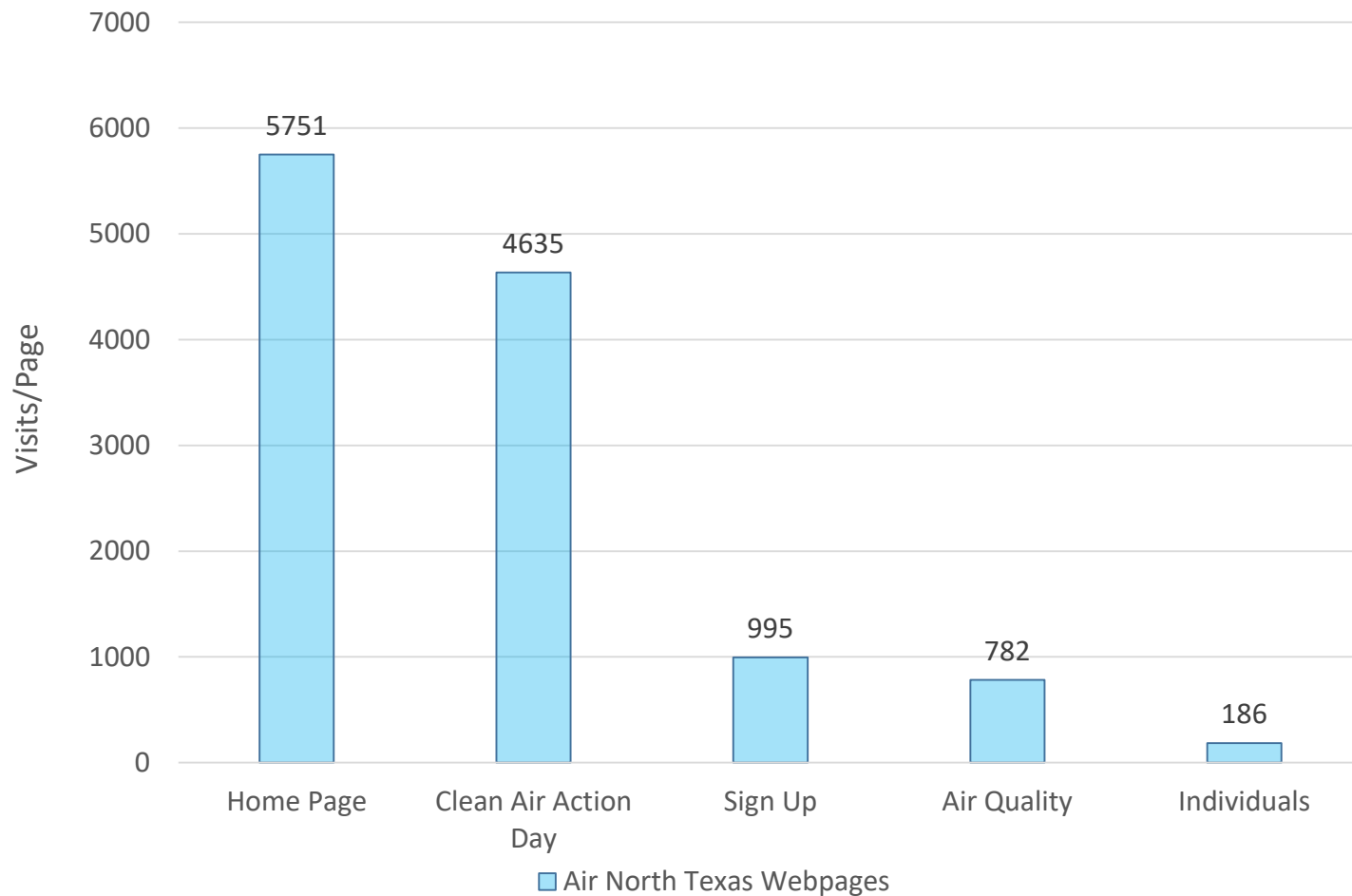

DFW OZONE ALERT

The Air Quality Index is **ORANGE**

Orange ozone days are unhealthy for sensitive groups which are people with lung diseases (such as asthma), older adults, children & teenagers, and people who are active outdoors.

Sensitive groups should:

- Schedule outdoor activities in the morning when ozone is lower.
- Take more breaks, do less intense activities when outside.
- Watch for symptoms such as coughing or shortness of breath.
- Plan indoor activities.
- Follow your asthma action plans and keep medicine handy.

Arlo is an Armadillo whose shell changes color based on the Air Quality Index. Arlo has asthma, so he knows when he can play outside (when he is green or yellow), and when he should limit his outdoor activity (when he is orange or red).

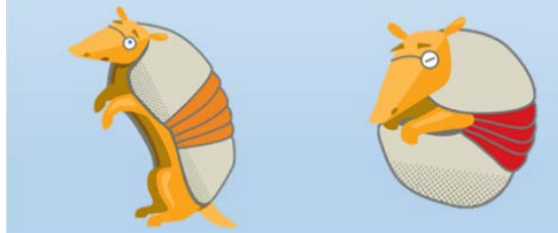

May 24, 2018

Ozone is predicted to be at Level Orange in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. On Ozone Action Days you can reduce ozone-forming emissions by implementing clean air strategies. Here are some great examples of things you can do to help improve air quality:

- Carpool or vanpool
- Bike or walk instead of driving
- Report smoking vehicles
- Observe the speed limit
- Reduce idling
- Combine trips
- Keep your vehicle maintained by getting it inspected, keeping tires properly inflated and changing filters regularly

Children, older adults and people with lung disease, such as asthma, emphysema, or chronic bronchitis, should limit outdoor activity if ozone reaches Level Orange. If ozone reaches Level Red, Children, older adults and people with lung disease, such as asthma, emphysema, or chronic bronchitis, should avoid outdoor activity. All other people should limit prolonged outdoor exertion if ozone reaches Level Red.
